Is there a unique contribution faculty can make to the task of recruiting students?

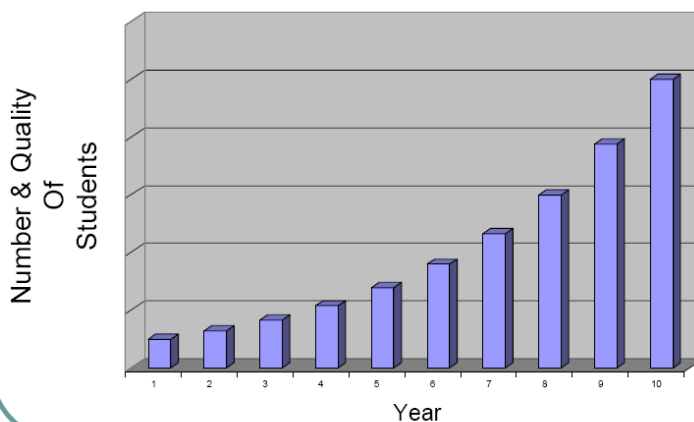
How can the department benefit from faculty involvement?
